

Peer-Review Statements

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All the articles in this proceedings volume have been presented at the International Academic Conference on Tourism 2022 during May 30–31, 2022 which was conducted online via zoom (http://ugm.id/INTACT) and based in Tour & Travel Business Program, Vocational College, Universitas Gadjah Mada, Indonesia. These articles have been peer reviewed by the members of the INTACT Reviewer Team and approved by the Editor-in-Chief, who affirms that this document is a truthful description of the conference's review process.

1 Review Procedure

The reviews were *single-blind*, and each submission was examined by 2 reviewer(s) independently.

The organizer distributed the submitted papers to the respective reviewers through email separately after firstly being screened for their scope and generic suitableness. The papers were then being handed over to each reviewer in accordance with the respective expertise by considering any competing interests at most. The reviewer then gave the revision notes and recommendation upon the respective papers. Editors delivered the revision notes to the authors for revision. The author the submitted the revised papers to the editors.

The revised papers were then taken back to the reviewers for final approval. A paper could only be considered for acceptance if it had received final approval from the reviewers as it met the revision notes and suggestions from the reviewers.

2 Quality Criteria

Reviewers were instructed to assess the quality of submissions solely based on the academic merit of their content along the following dimensions

- 1. The accuracy of the theme and scope of the articles toward the conference theme.
- 2. The level of originality, novelty, and timeliness of the issues discussed;
- 3. Soundness of the methods, analyses, and results;
- 4. Adherence to the ethical clearance, publication ethic, and codes of conduct relevant to the field;
- 5. Readability and accuracy in language.
- 6. Clarity and cohesion of the graphic attached.

In addition, all the articles have been checked for textual overlap to detect possible signs of plagiarism by the publisher using the plagiarism checker tool, Turnitin. Papers that were detected more than 15% Turnitin index were handed back to authors for revision.
