



Peer-Review Statements

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The articles in this proceedings volume were all presented at the ISIC International Conference 2022 on Education, Humanities, and Management (ICEHUM 2022, which took place on November 26, 2022, in Bangkok, Thailand. These articles have been peer-reviewed by the ICEHUM 2022 editorial board members, the Scientific Committee, experts, and researchers worldwide. In addition, they have been approved by the Editor-in-Chief, who confirms that this document accurately describes the conference's review process.

1 Review Procedure

The reviews were triple-blind reviews. Each submission was examined by at least three reviewers independently. The participants visit the website of ICEHUM 2022 at <https://isic.rmutk.ac.th/research/isic-international-conference-proceedings/> and submit the manuscript to conference_isic@mail.rmutk.ac.th.

The submissions were first screened for general quality and suitability. Following the initial screening, the committee reviews all manuscripts and uses Turnitin to check for plagiarism in each paper. After all, manuscripts have been checked, they are sent to the editor-in-chief for review and selection of which manuscripts are worthy of review. Next, they were sent for peer review by the editor-in-chief, who matched each paper's topic with the reviewers' expertise, taking into account any competing interests. An article could only be accepted if it received favorable recommendations from all three reviewers.

Following the review process, the scientific committee selects a manuscript from the three reviewers and sends it to the participant(s)/author(s) for revision. The author(s) revise and resubmit to the scientific committee for review and formatting. Finally, all accepted manuscripts are ready for publication.

Authors of rejected submissions were allowed to revise and resubmit after responding to the reviewers' comments. The decision to accept or reject a revised manuscript was final.

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2 Quality Criteria

Reviewers were requested to evaluate the quality of submissions based only on the academic merit of their material in the following areas:

1. Relevance of the article's content to the conference's scope and themes;
2. A clear indication of the research's originality, uniqueness, and relevance;
3. Validity of the procedures, analysis, and results;
4. Compliance with the relevant ethical standards and codes of behavior;
5. Clarity, coherence, and precision in the use of language and other kinds of communication, including figures and tables.

In addition, all the articles have been analyzed for linguistic overlap to identify any publisher plagiarizing. We only check at least 20% of each manuscript for instances of plagiarism.
