All of the articles in this proceedings volume have been presented at the *ICARSE 2022* during October 25 & 26, 2022 virtually from LPPM UPN “Veteran” Yogyakarta, Jl. Padjajaran 104 (Ringroad) Condongcatur, Yogyakarta 55283, Indonesia. These articles have been peer reviewed by the members of the *Scientific Committee* and approved by the Editor-in-Chief, who affirms that this document is a truthful description of the conference’s review process.

1 Review Procedure

The evaluations were carried out with one reviewer aware of their identity. Each application was given a thorough and impartial evaluation by a minimum of two reviewers.

PubEazy served as the submission management mechanism for the conference.

The contributions were initially evaluated to determine whether or not they met the criteria for general quality and appropriateness. After the preliminary examination, they were sent on to the next stage of evaluation, which consisted of matching the subject matter of each paper with the expertise of the reviewers, while also taking into consideration any conflicting interests. In order to be eligible for consideration for acceptance, a manuscript needed to have received positive recommendations from both of the reviewers.

The evaluators provided the authors of submissions that were not accepted with the opportunity to revise their work and resubmit it after they addressed the comments made by the reviewers. It was impossible to reconsider either the acceptance or the rejection of an updated manuscript.

2 Quality Criteria

Reviewers were instructed to evaluate the quality of the submissions purely based on the academic merit of the content of the papers, taking into consideration the following criteria:

1. The relevance of the article's substance to the goals of the conference and the topics that will be covered;
2. A definite and convincing demonstration of the research's originality, innovation, and relevance to the present;
3. The validity of the procedures, the analyses, and the findings;
4. Compliance with the ethical standards and codes of behavior that are applicable to the research field;
5. Clarity, coherence, and accuracy in the use of language as well as other forms of expression, including tables and figures

In addition, every article has been analyzed for instances of textual overlap in an attempt to identify any indications of plagiarism that may have been committed by the publisher.
