All of the articles in this proceedings volume have been presented at The 12th International Conference on Green Technology (ICGT) 2022 during October 26–27, 2022 virtually or onsite in Malang, Indonesia. These articles have been peer reviewed by the members of the Scientific Committee and approved by the Editor-in-Chief, who affirms that this document is a truthful description of the conference's review process.

1 Review Procedure

The reviews were single blind. Each submission was examined by 2 reviewers independently. The Open Journal System (OJS) was used as the conference submission management system was.

The submissions were first screened for generic quality and suitableness. The organizing committee will reject the submitted manuscript if it excludes the conference scope and the similarity check for plagiarism exceed the threshold 25%. After the initial screening, they were sent for peer review by matching each paper's topic with the reviewers' expertise, taking into account any competing interests. A paper could only be considered for acceptance if it had received favourable recommendations from the two reviewers.

2 Quality Criteria

Reviewers were instructed to assess the quality of submissions solely based on the academic merit of their content along the following dimensions:

- 1. Pertinence of the article's content to the scope and themes of the conference;
- 2. Clear demonstration of originality, novelty, and timeliness of the research;
- 3. Soundness of the methods, analyses, and results;
- 4. Adherence to the ethical standards and codes of conduct relevant to the research field;
- 5. Clarity, cohesion, and accuracy in language and other modes of expression, including figures and tables.

In an additional effort to identify any potential cases of plagiarism, the articles have all been examined for textual overlap. Turnitin is used to check for plagiarism with the parameters of exclude quotes, exclude bibliography, and exclude small sources fewer than 15 words.
