1 REVIEW PROCEDURE

The reviews were conducted by a member of the scientific committee (SC), who will read the paper and decide whether it is appropriate for the proceedings or journal of this conference. Manuscripts that are within scope and seem, on initial assessment, to be technically sound and scientifically valid, will be sent to 2 (two) blind reviewers independently. The conference submission management system was the Open Journal System (OJS).

The submissions were first screened by a member of SC for generic quality and suitableness. After the initial screening, they were sent for peer review by matching each paper's topic with the reviewers' expertise, taking into account any competing interests. After considering the reviewer reports the scientific committee will make the final decisions. In cases where the referees or scientific committee has requested changes to the manuscript, you will be invited to prepare a revision. The decision letter will specify a deadline for submission of a revised manuscript. Once resubmitted, the manuscript may then be sent back to the original referees or to new referees, at the scientific committee's discretion.

When all editorial issues were resolved, and it had received favourable recommendations from the two reviewers. Then, the paper will be formally accepted for publication. The acceptance or rejection of a revised manuscript was final.

Reviewers were instructed to assess the quality of submissions solely based on the academic merit of their content along the following dimensions.

- 1. Pertinence of the article's content to the scope and themes of the conference;
- 2. Clear demonstration of originality, novelty, and timeliness of the research;
- 3. Soundness of the methods, analyses, and results;
- 4. Adherence to the ethical standards and codes of conduct relevant to the research field;
- 5. Clarity, cohesion, and accuracy in language and other modes of expression, including figures and tables.

In addition, all of the articles have been checked for textual overlap in an effort to detect possible signs of plagiarism by the publisher. We have checked the originality of all accepted papers through machine learning – Turnitin to confirm the plagiarism rate.
