



Peer-Review Statements

These articles have been peer reviewed by the members of the [Scientific Committee] and approved by the Editor-in-Chief, who affirms that this document is a truthful description of the conference's review process.

1. REVIEW PROCEDURE

The reviews were *single-blind*. Each submission was examined by *two (2)* reviewer(s) independently.

The conference submission management system was EasyChair

The submissions were first screened for generic quality and suitability and scope of the proceeding. After the initial screening, they were sent for peer review by matching each paper's topic with the reviewers' expertise, taking into account any competing interests. A review of the manuscript will pay attention to the theory, method, research results and discussion, as well as conclusion that have been used by the author. A paper

could only be considered for acceptance if it had received favourable recommendations from the two reviewers. If the submitted article decision is a revision, the author will be contacted to revise the article according to the reviewer's comments and must be re-submit by the given time without no delay. The acceptance or rejection of a revised manuscript was final.

2. QUALITY CRITERIA

Reviewers were instructed to assess the quality of submissions solely based on the academic merit of their content along the following dimensions:

1. The article's content must relevant and suit to the scope and themes of the conference;
2. Clear demonstration of originality, novelty, and timeliness of the research;
3. Soundness of the methods, analyses, and results.
4. Adherence to the ethical standards and codes of conduct relevant to the research field.
5. Clarity, cohesion, and accuracy in language and other modes of expression, including figures and tables.
6. Follow the author guidelines of the proceeding.

All submitted articles have been checked for plagiarism through Turn it in application. The maximum limit of similarity is 25%. if the similarity content is more than 25% then the article is returned back to the author to revise the article to reduce the similarity content.
