All of the articles in this proceedings volume have been presented at the Policies, Processes and Practices for transforming Underdeveloped Economies into Developed Economies during 19 and 20 September 2025 in Delhi India. These articles have been peer reviewed by the members of the Technical Committee and approved by the Editor-in-Chief, who affirms that this document is a truthful description of the conference's review process.

1. REVIEW PROCEDURE

The reviews were double-blind. Each submission was examined by two reviewers independently.

The submissions were first screened for generic quality and suitability. After the initial screening, they were sent plagiarism check both by academic as well as the AI report. Most of the papers which are having more than 15% academic plagiarism or more than 25% of AI plagiarism were rejected at the screening itself. Few novel studies have given chance to revise the manuscript. After that, for peer review by matching each paper's topic with the reviewers' expertise, considering any competing interests. A paper could only be considered for acceptance if it had received favourable recommendations from the reviewer.

Manuscript with mild revisions were given the opportunity to revise and resubmit after addressing the reviewers' comments. The acceptance or rejection of a revised manuscript was final.

2. QUALITY CRITERIA

Reviewers were instructed to assess the quality of submissions solely based on the academic merit of their content along the following dimensions:

1. Novelty of the research
2. Practical Significance to the identified problem in the conference theme
3. Scope and timeliness of research.
